

## Here are a few key things to keep in mind when you come to the A/U Ranches:

- Check weather forecasts ahead of time for an idea of what to expect during your stay.
- Our packing checklist has been compiled over the years by considering what the average camper participating in a particular program will need. You will receive a guide with specific packing suggestions for the major your child has chosen.
- <u>The A/U Ranches will provide all program participants with mattress pads, sheets, blankets, pillows, towels, washcloth, bath mat and soap. If you are participating in a horse program, you will be provided with a horse and tack.</u>
- Label personal clothing. We do have a lost and found where lost items will remain for 30 days should you misplace something.
- We ask that there be no food in cabins. We have a lot of critters, large and small, that would love to get into your food. All meals, drinks and snacks will be provided in Chuck Wagon (Sky Valley) Lodge or Valerie (Round-Up) Lodge. (If there is a special need for food to be in a cabin, let us know so we can work with your child to make sure it is properly sealed.)
- Remember to check the details in your program guide for suggested arrival and departure times as well as shuttle schedules to the A/U Ranches. You will be asked to fill out a travel form online once you have registered which will allow us to know your travel plans and needs.
- Keep in mind that cell phone coverage is not always reliable at the Ranches. We do have a phone where calls can be made or received, but this service is limited during camp.
- Please respect that we are an alcohol and tobacco free Ranch. In addition, we do not allow any firearms or knives with more than a 3" blade.
