GENERAL DESCRIPTION: The Natural Resource Tech is responsible for forestry inventory and work; pasture management and fence building; as well as trail construction work.

PROFESSIONAL SUPPORT: The intern will work closely with the Ranch Foreman to understand the silviculture and pasture management practices of the ranch. The intern will also work with the trail crew, ranch directors, and co-counselors in cabins.

Natural Resource Tech SPECIFIC DUTIES:

- Cruise AU's 500 acres of timber using silviculture standards
- Continue pasture surveys and help with building temporary and permanent fences
- Join Trail Crew and assist in the maintenance and building of new trails (<50%)
- Possible option of becoming chainsaw certified through a S-212 class and performing sawyer work throughout the summer (dependent on candidates)

- Ability to input data into software and keep detailed notes while outside
- Ability to work outside 95% of the time
